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FY 2014 EXTENSION OF WORKSHARING AGREEMENT

Statement of Agreement:

Inasmuch as there have been no substantive changes in the processes, procedures, statutes, policies, or regulation that would adversely affect or substantially alter the work sharing arrangement between the EEOC - Charlotte District Office and the **Office of the Attorney General (Virginia), Division of Human Rights**, or that would affect the processing of charges filed under the pertinent Federal, State, or Local, statutes, the parties agree to extend the current work sharing agreement that was executed on October 3, 2011, through the Fiscal Year 2014 Charge Resolution Contract Option Period. The agencies agree to work together in furtherance of the provisions of EEOC's 2012-2016 Strategic Plan, when assessing the allocation of charges under this agreement and to cooperate in compliance and enforcement efforts as well as training, outreach, and technical assistance efforts encompassed by that Plan. By executing this extension, the parties agree to abide by the confidentiality provisions of GINA as well as the other statutes cited in the agreement. This agreement, as well as the attendant Worksharing Agreement may be reopened and amended by mutual consent of the parties.
